RELENTLESS TYRANNOSAURUS

DKTB-001 / 100

Rarity: S **Length:** ~43ft.
Name Means: "tyrant lizard" **Discovered in:** Canada/America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Tyrannosaurus is the most famous of the carnivorous dinosaurs. Its massive jaws were lined with sharp teeth.

MAPUSAURUS

DKTB-002 / 100 and DKTB-091 / 100

Rarity: G and CR **Length:** ~43 ft.
Name Means: "earth lizard" **Discovered in:** Argentina
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: A recently discovered carnivore, related to the Giganotosaurus. The Mapusaurus had teeth as sharp as knives.

MAD CARCHARODONTOSAURUS

DKTB-003 / 100 and DKTB-092 / 100

Rarity: S and CR **Length:** ~43 ft.
Name Means: "shark-toothed lizard" **Discovered in:** Egypt/Morocco
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Carcharodontosaurus got its name from its shark-like teeth. It was a massive carnivore.

PROWLING DASPLETOSAURUS

DKTB-004 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~30 ft.
Name Means: "frightful lizard" **Discovered in:** Canada/America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Daspletosaurus lived in the Cretaceous period in the same time and place as the Gorgosaurus. A carnivore, it preyed on dinosaurs like the Centrosaurus.

YANGCHUANOSAURUS

DKTB-005 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~33 ft.
Name Means: "lizard of Yang-ch'uan" **Discovered in:** China
Time Period: Jurassic
Description: The Yangchuanosaurus was one of the largest carnivorous dinosaurs found in Asia. It had big, sharp teeth and two ridge-like crests on its head.

PROWLING ACROCANTHOSAURUS

DKTB-006 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~43 ft.
Name Means: "high spine lizard" **Discovered in:** America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Acrocanthosaurus was a large, carnivorous dinosaur. It was easily identifiable by the fin-like ridge on its neck and back.

ALPHA GORGOSAURUS

DKTB-007 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~30 ft.
Name Means: "terrible lizard" **Discovered in:** Canada
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: Although it was related to the Tyrannosaurus, the Gorgosaurus had a narrow body. It had short arms and long legs.

AMPELOSAURUS

DKTB-008 / 100 and DKTB-093 / 100

Rarity: G and CR **Length:** ~59 ft.
Name Means: "vine lizard" **Discovered in:** France
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: An herbivore with spiked armor on its back, it was related to the Titanosaurus.

ROARING AMARGASAURUS

DKTB-009 / 100 and DKTB-094 / 100

Rarity: S and CR **Length:** ~39 ft.
Name Means: "lizard from La Amarga" **Discovered in:** Argentina
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This herbivore had two rows of long spines on its neck. These spines were actually extensions of the bones in its neck.



CETIOSAURUS

DKTB-010 / 100

Rarity: S **Length:** ~49 ft.
Name Means: "whale lizard" **Discovered in:** England/Morocco
Time Period: Jurassic
Description: This dinosaur got its name because the first fossils of it discovered were mistaken for whale bones. It was a very large herbivore.

SUNRISE SHUNOSAURUS

DKTB-011 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~39 ft.
Name Means: "lizard of Sichuan" **Discovered in:** China
Time Period: Jurassic
Description: A four-legged herbivore discovered in China, the Shunosaurus had a spiked club at the end of its tail.



SWIFT SUCHOMIMUS

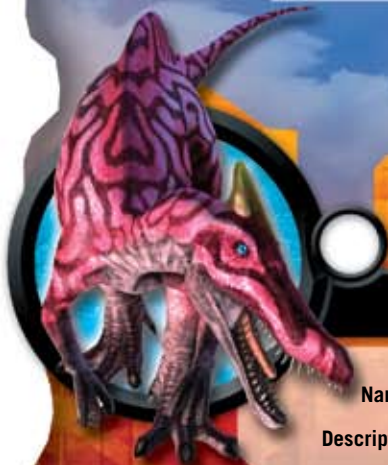
DKTB-012 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~36 ft.
Name Means: "crocodile mimic" **Discovered in:** Niger
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This dinosaur probably ate fish. It's known for its very narrow face.

WADING NEMEGTOSAURUS

DKTB-013 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~39 ft.
Name Means: "Nemegt lizard" **Discovered in:** Mongolia/China
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Nemegtosaurus, an herbivore, lived in what's now Mongolia and China. Other dinosaurs that shared its habitat in Mongolia include the Tarbosaurus and the Tarchia.



ALPHA IRRITATOR

DKTB-014 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~26 ft.
Name Means: "Challenger's irritator" **Discovered in:** Brazil
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This carnivore's strange face looked a lot like a dragon. It had a very noticeable crest on its head.

PENTACERATOPS

DKTB-015 / 100 and DKTB-095 / 100

Rarity: G and CR **Length:** ~26 ft.
Name Means: "five-horned face" **Discovered in:** America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: An herbivore with a large neck frill. Although it had only three actual horns, its cheekbones stuck out, making it look like it had five horns in all.

RAMPAGING ANCHICERATOPS

DKTB-016 / 100 and DKTB-096 / 100

Rarity: S and CR **Length:** ~20 ft.
Name Means: "near-horned face" **Discovered in:** Canada
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This herbivore had a long frill on its neck. Its two horns pointed out to the left and right.

ALBERTACERATOPS

DKTB-017 / 100

Rarity: S **Length:** ~20 ft.
Name Means: "Alberta horned face" **Discovered in:** Canada
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: A horned herbivore recently discovered in Canada. Its skull was unusually shaped for a horned dinosaur, and it had two long horns above its eyes.

ROAMING ARRHINOCERATOPS

DKTB-018 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~23 ft.
Name Means: "no nose-horn face" **Discovered in:** Canada
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This herbivore's frill was shaped like a trapezoid. It had three horns, but the one on its nose was short.

DICERATOPS

DKTB-019 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~26 ft.
Name Means: "two-horned face" **Discovered in:** Canada/America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: Although it looked a lot like the Triceratops, the Diceratops had only two horns on its head. It is also known as the Nedoceratops.

WATER'S EDGE EUCENTROSAURUS

DKTB-020 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~20 ft.
Name Means: "big-horned lizard" **Discovered in:** Canada/America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Eucentrosaurus probably lived in large herds. The horn above its nose pointed slightly forward.

CENTROSAURUS

DKTB-021 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~20 ft.
Name Means: "horned lizard" **Discovered in:** Canada/America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: Related to the Styracosaurus, the Centrosaurus was an herbivore that probably traveled in herds.

EUOPLOCEPHALUS

DKTB-022 / 100 and DKTB-097 / 100

Rarity: G and CR **Length:** ~23 ft.
Name Means: "well-armored head" **Discovered in:** Canada / America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This herbivore was covered with tough armor, all the way to its eyelids.

GIGANTSPINOSAURUS

DKTB-023 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~20 ft.
Name Means: "giant-spined lizard" **Discovered in:** China
Time Period: Jurassic
Description: The Gigantspinosaurus had two really large spikes on its shoulders, and its back was lined with spike-like plates. Despite its fearsome appearance, it was an herbivore.

GRAZING TARCHIA

DKTB-024 / 100

Rarity: S **Length:** ~26 ft.
Name Means: "brainy one" **Discovered in:** Mongolia
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This is the largest armored dinosaur found in Asia. An herbivore, it protected itself with its armored body and clubbed tail.

TUOJIANGOSAURUS

DKTB-025 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~23 ft.
Name Means: "Tuojiang lizard" **Discovered in:** China
Time Period: Jurassic
Description: Although they lived in different places, this herbivore looked a lot like the Stegosaurus. It had two rows of plates on its back.

POLACANTHUS

DKTB-026 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~16 ft.
Name Means: "many spikes" **Discovered in:** England
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The back of the Polacanthus was protected by two rows of spikes, and its hips were protected by bony plates.

PACK PROTECTOR DACENTRURUS

DKTB-027 / 100

Rarity: S **Length:** ~14 ft.
Name Means: "very sharp tail" **Discovered in:** England/France/Portugal
Time Period: Jurassic
Description: This herbivore had two rows of small plates covering its back. The spike on its tail was used for fighting.

PINACOSAURUS

DKTB-028 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~18 ft.
Name Means: "plank lizard" **Discovered in:** Mongolia/China
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: An armored herbivore. Many fossils of young Pinacosaurus have been found in the Gobi desert.

SAUROLOPHUS

DKTB-029 / 100 and DKTB-098 / 100

Rarity: G and CR **Length:** ~39 ft.
Name Means: "crested lizard" **Discovered in:** Canada / Mongolia
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: A massive herbivore, the Saurolophus had a crest that extended out behind its head. This crest was an extension of its nose bone.

CHARONOSAURUS

DKTB-030 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~43 ft.
Name Means: "Charon's lizard" **Discovered in:** China
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This herbivore was closely related to the Parasauroplophus. It had the same kind of hollow crest on its head.

CHARGING LAMBEOSAURUS

DKTB-031 / 100

Rarity: S **Length:** ~49 ft.
Name Means: "Lambe's lizard" **Discovered in:** Canada/America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Lambeosaurus was an herbivore with an odd-shaped frill on its head. It was one of the largest duck-billed dinosaurs.

SPOTTED ANATOTITAN

DKTB-032 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~39 ft.
Name Means: "duck titan" **Discovered in:** America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: One of the duck-billed dinosaurs, the Anatotitan used its wide bill to scoop up plants to eat.

EDMONTOSAURUS

DKTB-033 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~33 ft.
Name Means: "lizard from Edmonton" **Discovered in:** Canada / America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The wide mouth of the Edmontosaurus contained hundreds of teeth, called a dental battery. It used them to crush the plants that it ate.

GUARDIAN FUKUISAURUS

DKTB-034 / 100 and DKTB-099 / 100

Rarity: G and CR **Length:** ~15 ft.
Name Means: "lizard from Fukui" **Discovered in:** Japan
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Fukuisaurus is named for Fukui Prefecture in Japan, where it was discovered.

LEAELLYNASAURA HEALER

DKTB-035 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~10 ft.
Name Means: "Leaellyn's lizard" **Discovered in:** Australia
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: Because of this dinosaur's huge eyes, some scientists think it was nocturnal. Besides Australia, it also lived in Antarctica.

MEGARAPTOR

DKTB-036 / 100 and DKTB-100 / 100

Rarity: G and CR **Length:** ~30 ft.
Name Means: "giant thief" **Discovered in:** Argentina
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This carnivore is thought to have been extremely vicious. The claws on its hind legs were over a foot long.

MAJUNGASAUROS

DKTB-037 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~23 ft.
Name Means: "lizard of Mahajanga" **Discovered in:** Madagascar
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Majungasaurus had very short arms and a horn on its head. The carnivorous Majungasaurus are known to have even eaten each other.



WAR CRY CERATOSAURUS

DKTB-038 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~20 ft.
Name Means: "horned lizard" **Discovered in:** America/Tanzania
Time Period: Jurassic
Description: It's believed that the Ceratosaurus was a good swimmer and that it preyed on fish and crocodiles. It also hunted dinosaurs like the Apatosaurus.

GALLIMIMUS

DKTB-039 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~20 ft.
Name Means: "chicken mimic" **Discovered in:** Mongolia
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Gallimimus was the largest of the ostrich-like dinosaurs. Its long legs meant it could run very fast.



RUGOPS

DKTB-040 / 100

Rarity: S **Length:** ~30 ft.
Name Means: "wrinkle face" **Discovered in:** Niger
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: This dinosaur got its name from the many wrinkles on its skull. It was a carnivore, but its small teeth indicate that it may have been a scavenger, not a hunter.



INDOSUCHUS

DKTB-041 / 100

Rarity: C **Length:** ~20 ft.
Name Means: "crocodile from India" **Discovered in:** India
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: Only a few skull bones of Indosuchus have been found. It was probably related to the Abelisaurus.



TROODON

DKTB-042 / 100

Rarity: S **Length:** ~7 ft.
Name Means: "wounding tooth" **Discovered in:** Canada/America
Time Period: Cretaceous
Description: The Troodon had unique, saw-like teeth. Its large eyes and large brain mean that it was probably very smart.
